Social Studies: Pioneer Life ECS to grade 5

Learn about pioneer life in central Alberta - plowing, seeding, haying, harvesting and more. Feed chickens, make butter, cook on a wood stove, visit a 1889 log home, pump water and take part in other farm chores. The only program like it in central Alberta!
